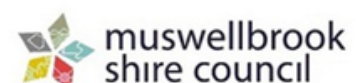
Welcome to our May edition. The past month has been a busy and exciting one. We supported program participants during immersion days, and have continued to refine plans for a range of upcoming events.

From this month, we are delivering a series of workshops across five schools in the Upper Hunter, focused on showcasing career opportunities within the renewable energy sector. Delivered in partnership with **Regional Development Australia - Hunter**, each workshop will involve 30 students in an engaging, hands on experience designed to build skills and inspire interest in renewable energy careers. Students will collaborate to build a wind turbine and use a leaf blower to generate energy, charge a battery, and produce light. Industry role models and mentors will be present throughout the sessions, providing guidance during activities and sharing insights into their own career pathways to help bridge classroom learning with real world opportunities.

Our Pathways to Employment workshops are also gaining momentum, with preparations underway for a July commencement. These workshops will equip participants with practical job readiness skills, including resume writing, cover letters, workplace communication, job searching, financial literacy, workplace rights, and more.

The aim of both visits was to highlight that construction is not just one job, but a diverse industry offering opportunities across a wide range of skills, interests and strengths.

Both days were designed to inform, inspire and broaden perceptions of what a future in construction could look like.
